

**SCHEDULE OF FEES  
COMPENSATION OF APPOINTED COUNSEL  
FOR INDIGENT CRIMINAL DEFENDANTS**

Pursuant to the provisions of Art. 26.05, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, the following schedule of fees is hereby adopted by the undersigned County and District Criminal Court Judges of the 110<sup>th</sup> Judicial District:

A.	Misdemeanor	\$200.00
B.	State Jail, 3 <sup>rd</sup> Degree Felony	\$300.00
C.	2 <sup>nd</sup> Degree Felony, 1 <sup>st</sup> Degree Felony	\$350.00

The above fixed rates include mileage and all reimbursable expenses.

At the judge's discretion, upon request by the court-appointed attorney, instead of the above fixed rate, a rate of \$70.00 per hour plus expenses, including mileage, may be compensated. Mileage will be calculated at a rate of \$.345 per mile, not to exceed the following amount for each county.

Briscoe County	\$119.08
Dickens County	\$86.12
Floyd County	\$70.12
Motley County	\$111.52

In felony cases, including capital cases, appointment and reimbursement for reasonable and necessary investigation, mental health and other experts shall be as provided by law and only upon written motion and prior approval of the trial judge for such appointment and anticipated reimbursement.

The judge may in his discretion adjust the compensation to be paid to court appointed counsel if he believes, upon review of the Application of Compensation, overpayment has been requested due to an excessive amount of hours being entered on said application. In exceptional circumstances, the judge may deviate from the above numerations.
